5	Trustee Update – Shelley Kinley	December School Council Report 2024 1) At our last Board meeting, we were able to celebrate
		 1) At our last board meeting, we were able to celebrate students who achieved 100% on their diploma exam. Seven students were celebrated for Biology, Math, Physics and Chemistry. Some of these students have received 100% on multiple exams. Kudos! 2) The Board approved the Terms of Reference to create an ad hoc Superintendent Search Committee to support the recruitment process and work has begun. We started with a staff survey report. We hope to have our Ad placement out by January. 3) The Board will be reviewing feedback from the Chestermere Student Accommodation over the next month. The RVS Engage closed at the end of November. Thank you to all who participated. 4) Additional funding from the provincial government was also approved over the summer. The Board has approved a spending plan which includes school transition for new students with complex needs, enhancements to our IT infrastructure and resources and technology for schools to support the BASS student accommodations. Remaining funds will be

included in instruction contingency as part of the fall update.
 5) As a Board, we participated at the ASBA Fall General Meeting November 17th – 19th, 2024 in Edmonton. We were able to advance educational issues and share information and issues about our school division with MLA's, the education minister and the Premier.
 6) Please look online and check the highlights of our Annual Education Results. There has been growth in both literacy and numeracy skills numbers, the percentage of students on par with provincial achievement has been improved or maintained, especially in Math 30-1 results (now at 73%), and the high school completion rate continues to exceed the provincial average.
 7) Each year School Divisions are required to submit audited financial statements to the Minister of Education by November 30th. Again, this year, RVS was given a clean report for 2023/2024. Final revenues were 314.7 and expenses were 314.2 million resulting in a small surplus. We ended the year with 7.7 million in total operating reserves (2.4% of the operating budget). Most of these reserve dollars are in Transportation. The government has mandated a range of 1 – 3.2% reserve balance for this school year.
 8) Planning is underway for the 2025 Trustee Election. We have appointed a returning officer. We also approved formalizing the joint school election agreement with local municipal governments for the next election – October 20, 2025.
 9) Representatives from the Chestermere and Area Community Coalition, Synergy Youth and Community Development Society presented to the Board about the work they are doing in Chestermere, Langdon and Southeast Calgary. 10)The Board will also be looking for feedback from School Councils. A short questionnaire will be forwarded to the Parent Council for feedback. Look for it over the next few weeks. We will use to inform best practices for our School Council events.

		11)A Long Service and Retirees awards ceremony was held in November. Staff were recognized for 20, 25, 30 and 35 years of service along with retirees.
6	Admin Update	 1.School concerts – how the classes /grades are split for performances: Mrs. Crooks has been teaching music for 23 years! "I have a Bachelor of Music in vocal performance and a BEd. I helped to open STS in 2012 and taught here for 10 years. It was the happiest time of my career. I left to pursue full-time teaching, when the opportunity presented itself and worked at ELS from 2022-2024. In that time, I realized how much I missed being at a smaller school. At STS I have the opportunity to teach music 3 x a week and can see the love of music grow and the skills develop quickly. I am thrilled to be back!" At STS all students have the opportunity to perform at some point during the year. This year everyone performed in the Remembrance Day assembly in some way. As we have many combined classes the concerts will be broken down as follows: Christmas – 1/2W, 2B, 3/4M, 4N, 4/5R Spring – 1L, 1W, 3B, 3H Year End Farewell – TBD what that will look like 5C, 5P and 4/5R (just the 5's) With splitting the classes up for the different concerts, each student gets a little more time on stage to perform. 2. Principal transition – Ryan introduced Jennifer, and she gave us a little about her background. Ryan and Jennifer have met previously and toured the school, and she has met most the staff and students. Ryan has been sharing information on staffing, student's with SSP'S, budget, supervision, timetables, teacher and support staff evaluations, school goals and survey results, where the school has been and where it is going. 3. The Studio – Ms. Wentworth and Ms. Behal gave us a tour of the new classroom. They explained how they came up with the idea and all that the room has to offer to all students. This space is designed to provide students opportunities to be creative, collaborative and use their imagination. It is a space to foster curiosity and play.
