Projects such as washroom upgrades (Beiseker), flooring and roof replacements, HVAC upgrades and replacements, Chestermere High School Lift station, the installation of A/C units in modulars and the completion of the artificial turf field at Horseshoe Crossing High School. Not all projects have been completed due to permitting issues, waiting for parts and contractor availability. The Operations department is working diligently to assist schools to get students' classrooms completed as soon as possible.
- 5) School Councils Chair Orientation Session September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2025 @ 6:30 online. Any member of your School Council is welcome to attend. Also, Save the date November 6th, 2025 the Joint School Board Council Meeting will be held at the Education Center for Chairs and Vice Chairs of your School Council.
- 6) Exemplary Practice Grade 2's Hooked on Learning through Trout Program. Cooper's Crosssing students participated in the Fish in Schools (FinS) program. Students experience the life cycle of trout. Fish eggs are provided to students who hatch, care and then release the trout. Students learn empathy while caring for the eggs, draw pictures of them, write about them and use numeracy skills and math challenges, and ensure the feeding and growth schedules are kept up to date. Students loved caring for the fish and even named them.
- 7) Revisions to Board Policy 27 Trustee Compensation and Development were approved at our Sept 4<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting. Changes to the policy include additional travel honoraria for trustees in large rural wards, as well as a transitional allowance for service as a Trustee along with wording clarifications.
